- Speak about yourself.

What's your name? How do you spell your surname? How old are you? What's your address? What's your e-mail address? Where are you from? What do you do? Where do you live? Where does your surname come from? How many brothers and sisters do you have?

- ASK ME MY NAME, AGE, ADDRESS, ETC. / ASK ME HER/HIS NAME, AGE, E-MAIL ADDRESS, ETC

What's your phone number? Can you say these numbers? 8 89 100 900 72 54 28 67 890 ... Can you read these pairs of numbers? 13-30; 14-40; 15-50; 16,60; 17-70; 18-18; 90,90

- Speak about countries and nationalities. Consider the maps at page 149. What nationality are the people from Spain? / France?/ etc? Where are your parents/grandparents/from? Where is pasta from? Where are tapas from? Where is the dollar/the rouble/the pound from?
- What day is it today? And tomorrow? What days are the weekend days? What days are the weekdays? What's your favourite day of the week? Why? What's your favourite weekend day? Why?

2A A writer's room

- Speak about the place where you generally study.

Do you study on a table, or on a desk? What do you have on your table? Is it tidy/messy/a mess? Is it untidy?

2B Stars and Stripes- Adjectives and modifiers

What colour is your flag? What colour are these flags? What flags are these? (pictures at page 14)

- Describe a person you know (a member of your family, a friend, a teacher, a famous actor) Use appearance adjectives and modifiers (page 152)

Is he/she tall? Are they slim/overweight/etc? What colour eyes does he/she have? Describe his/her hair. What nationality is he/she?

2C After 300 metres, turn right- Imperatives – Lets – Feelings.

- Do the *What's the matter* dialogue.

Make sentences about the people at page 16, describing the way they feel.

- How do you feel today/now? Are you tired/nervous/stressed/hungry/ etc?

What do these signs mean? (pictures at page 17)

3A Things I love about Britain – Present simple – verb phrases – third person singular.

- Speak about the British. (page 20)

What do you know about British people? (tea, coffee, the weather, the food, pets, cooking programmes, restaurants, pubs, etc)

What do most people think about the British weather/tea time/pets/food? Is it true?

Do British people drink tea at 5.00? Does it rain a lot? Does it rain every day? Do British people like animals? Is the food in Britain good? Where can I have good British Food? Is it expensive?

3B Work and play – Present simple - Jobs

- Speak about a person's job (someone you know) What does he or she do? Where does he or she work? When? How? Does he or she need/have special qualifications? Does he or she wear a uniform? Does he or she earn a lot of money? Does she or he work in an office?/ in the street?/ inside?/outside?; Does he or she work in the evening?/ at night?/ at the weekend?/ Does he or she work with computers?/ with other people?/ long hours?/ Does he or she speak foreign languages?/ travel?/ drive?/ make things?/ Etc
Does he/she work for a company? In an office? In a hospital? In a shop? Is he/she at university/school?
Is he/she retired/unemployed?

3C Love online – Word order in questions – Question words

- Ask and answer questions.
What do you do? Where do you live? What food do you like? What kind of films do you prefer? Where do you study?/ work?/ What sports do you play? What magazines do you read? What TV programmes do you watch? What languages do you speak? What car do you have? What kind of music do you listen to? What kind of films do you like? What is your favourite TV programme? What's your favourite restaurant? Who's your favourite singer? Who's your favourite actor? **ASK ME**
- Speak about a person you know in the same way.

4.A Is she his wife or his sister? – Whose – Possessive 's – The family

- Speak about your family (Bring a photo)

Answer questions about the members of the family and the relationships among them. Page 155

4.B What a life! – Prepositions at,in,on (time and place) Everyday activities.

- Answer questions about the article Father and Daughter (page 30-31)
What time does Nico get up? What does he have for breakfast? Where does he work? Why does he go to the market? Etc.
What time does Nico's daughter get up? Etc.
- Speak about yourself. Describe a typical weekday and a typical weekend in your life
Speak about your **daily routine**. Is it stressful? What time do you get up? Do you have a shower in the morning? What do you do after that? What time do you go to university? What time do you finish classes? What do you do after that? Etc.
- Speak about **Suzy Stressed** and **Henry Healthy's** routines. Speak about the daily routine of a member of your family.

4.C short life, long life? – Adverbs and expressions of frequency (position in the sentence)

- Make questions with *how often* and answer using expressions of time and frequency. (p.157)
What time is it? What time do you come to classes? What time do you get up? Etc
How often do you eat out? Where do you eat out? What do you generally have for breakfast?
How often do you eat meat? How many hours a day do you spend online? How often do you go to the hairdresser? /visit your grandparents/ see your friends/ etc. How often do you go to the cinema?

5.A Do you have the X factor? – can/can't – verb phrases

- Ask and answer questions with can/can't

Can you sing or play a musical instrument? Can you cook? Drive? Draw? Speak foreign languages? Can you do a winter sport? run a marathon? Can you dance well? Can your mother cook?

5.B Love your neighbours – Present continuous – verb phrases

- Speak about problems with neighbours.

Do you have **noisy neighbours**? What are the things that can cause problems with neighbours? (p.38)

- What are they doing? (picture pages 38, 102, 107)

Say with people in the different pictures are doing. E.g. What is the couple in flat 5 doing? Are they arguing? Are they sleeping? Etc. What is the baby doing?

- What are the members of your family doing right now? Are they at home? Is your mum cooking?

5.C Sun and the City – Present Simple vs. Present Continuous – The weather and seasons

- Answer questions about the weather and seasons.

What is the weather like today? What was the weather like yesterday? What's the weather like in Mendoza in winter/autumn/summer/spring? What's your favourite weather?

Is it raining today? Was it raining yesterday?

What's your **favourite month**? Which are the spring months? And the summer months? And the winter months? And the autumn months? What month is it?

What's your **favourite season** and why? What's the weather like in that season? What season is it?

What is the typical **weather** like in Mendoza? What is the normal temperature in the summer? Does it snow in the winter?

When is your birthday? When is Christmas day? / and the National Flag's Day? And Independence day?

When were you born? Read the dates on page 159 and say them.

6.A Reading in English – Object pronouns: me, you, him, her, it, us, you, them

- Read the introduction to *Red Roses*, *Sally's phone* and *Dead Man's Money*

Which book is a love story? What are those stories about?

6.B Times we love – like/love/hate/don't mind + verb + ING – The date – Ordinal numbers

- Ask and answer questions about favourite times.

What's your favourite public holiday and why? What's your favourite time of day and why? What's your favourite season? What's your favourite time of year?

What do you enjoy doing at the weekend? On fine weather? What music do you like listening to? Do you like cooking? What do you really hate doing? Do you like reading? What are you reading at the moment? What do the people at page 47 enjoy doing?

6.C Music is changing their lives – Revision of Be and Do

How often do you go to concerts? /how often do you go dancing? How do you usually listen to music? (on the radio/online/on CDs

What kind of music do you like listening to when you are sad/ happy/stressed?

7.A At the National Portrait Gallery – Past Simple of Be: was, were

- Answer questions about the National Portrait Gallery. Where is it? What can you see there? What is a portrait? When is it open? How much does it cost?
- Answer questions about King Edward VIII and Wallis Simpson. What nationality was she? What was the problem with her? How long was he king? Was it a scandal? Who was the next king? Were they happy? Were they together for the rest of their lives?
- Ask and answer questions. Where were you yesterday at 5 in the afternoon? And your mother? And your girlfriend/boyfriend/best friend? Etc. Where were you born? Where were your parents born? Etc. When were you born?

7.B Chelsea girls – Past time expressions. Simple past of regular verbs: ed

- Answer questions about the Spencer Sisters. Where did they want to go? What did they do in the back of the car? Did they talk to the taxi driver? What did they see when they looked out of the window? Why were the girls surprised? Were they at the stadium? Where were they? Whose fault was it (the taxi driver's fault or the girls' fault?)
- What did you do yesterday? What did you do at the weekend? What did you do last summer holidays? Did you get up early?/late? / Have breakfast? / play video games?/ go out?/ cook lunch?/etc. ASK ME

7.C A night to remember – Past simple. Irregular verbs.

- Speak about Maria Julia and Mehmet. When was it? Where was she/he? What did he/she wear? What did he/she do? What was the weather like? What time did she/he get back home? Why was it a memorable night?
- Speak about a memorable night in your life. What did you do? Where did you go? Who did you go with? What did you eat? What did you drink? Was it expensive? What did you buy? How much did you pay? What time did you get back home? Why do you remember it? Why was it special or memorable? ASK ME

8. B THE HOUSE – There is/ There are – There was/ there were

- Describe your home (house or flat). What is there in each room?
- Answer questions about your house or flat. Do you live in a house or a flat? How old is it? How big is it? (Very big, quite big, not very big) How many bedrooms are there? How many bathrooms are there? Is there a study? Is there a garden? Is there a balcony? Is there a garage? Is there central heating? Is there air conditioning? Do you like it? Why do you like it? Why don't you like it?
- Interview a partner about his/her home. ASK ME
